# Planning ahead.....

Some thoughts from Nick Thomas, Provincial Membership Office, on new candidates – identification, contact and Lodge profiling for when restrictions are lifted.

Using Social Media and the charitable efforts of our contacts, to list potential candidates



During this time of restricted activity – many of us find ourselves spending more time on social media. Likewise, we are seeing many more of our contacts posting about their charitable efforts to aid the NHS, Care Works, Key Works or any other essential service. Could these men, displaying that integral character of a freemason – be considered for an approach and introduction to Freemasonry, once we are back to (semi) normality. Step 2 of the Pathway initiative involves us listing potential candidates – could we use Social Media to assist with this step?

#### Staying in contact with planned initiates.

With the suspension of all masonic activity, we are all missing our lodge, our meetings and our camaraderie. For those lodges with candidates in the pipeline – are you staying in touch with them? Could we use this time of suspension to get to know our candidates even better? Phone calls, Zoom conferences, even letters – it is a rare additional window of time, to better understand who our candidate is, his motivation and what he's looking for. Whilst assisting to build a better picture of his expectations, it also keeps him engaged, interested and shows we care about them.
